Saints Leo Ignatius Mangin, Priest, Mary Zhu Wu and Companions, Martyrs

Memorial

The four French Jesuit priests commemorated today, **Leo Ignatius Mangin**, **Paul Denn**, **Rémy Isoré**, and **Modeste Andlauer**, were martyred in China during the Boxer Rebellion in 1900, together with a large number of Christian lay men and women. When the Boxers, a militant organization, attacked the mission at Wuyi, **Mary Zhu-Wu**, a faithful, stood in front of Fr Mangin with arms extended, to protect him, and she was shot dead.

O God, who in your holy Martyrs have wonderfully made known the mystery of the Cross, graciously grant that, drawing strength from this sacrifice, we may cling faithfully to Christ and labour in the Church for the salvation of all. Through Christ our Lord.
