Fr PETER DUPEYRON

3 March 1855 – 16 February 1935

Born in Cazéres, France, Dupeyron entered the Society in 1875 and represents the wider Zambezi Mission. Arriving in Mozambique in 1889 he was one of those who founded a mission in 1890 on the Lower Zambezi Mission 'at Melange, halfway between Quilimane and Lake Nyassa (Malawi), not far from the Shiré River' (*Letters and Notices for 1890*). He was there from 1887-90. Before that he had been at Dunbrody for tertianship (1887). He came back in 1904 and worked in Quelimane and Coalani. He left in 1914

He died at Tananarive in 1935.

16 February

3 March 1855 – 16 February 1935

Fr. Pedro C. DUPEYRON

He was born in Cazères, Landes, France, on March 3, 1855 and entered the Society of Jesus on September 7, 1875. He was sent to the Zambezia Mission (Mozambique) in 1889. After spending some time in Quelimane, he went, in 1890, to found the mission of St. Francis Xavier in Tumbini, Milange. He professed his final vows in Tumbini, Milange, on February 2, 1892. In 1896, he went to Europe where he worked as minister and teacher of French and English at Campolide College, in Lisbon. He returned to Mozambique in 1904 and worked in Quelimane and in the mission of Coalane. He left Mozambique after the revolution of 1910, in 1814. He went as a missionary to Madagascar and died on February 16, 1935, in Tananarive. The following are the books that he wrote: Gramática e Selecta da língua de Quelimane, Echuabo, mns. s/d; Bilingual Catechism, echuabo - Portuguese; Homilies in echuabo and Cafreais Fables, mns. APSI, 317/04, 05, 06 07 e 08; Pequeno Vadamecum da língua banto na Província de Moçambique ou breve estudo da língua Chi-Yao ou Adjaua comparada com os dialectos de Sena, Tete e Quelimane, Lisboa.
