**Br. Pedro BÖEHMER**

He was born in Huttseifen, Koblenz, Germany, on March 9, 1869, and entered the Society of Jesus on July 5, 1890, at Barro. He was sent to the Zambezia Mission (Mozambique) in 1894. He spent some time in the residence of Quelimane and then he was sent to the mission of Miruro, Zumbo, where he took his final vows on March 30, 1902. In 1906, he returned to Portugal, working at the Setubal and the Campolide Colleges. In 1910, he returned to Mozambique to work in the Boroma mission. In 1911, he was requested to go to St. Ignatius College in Sydney, Australia, to work as assistant to the director of the Meteorological and Seismological Observatory of the College. In 1926, he went to Shiu-Hing (China) where he was in charge of the mission's Industrial School. In 1931, he was sent to St. Joseph's Seminary in Macau. There, he worked as an infirmarian and took care of the housekeeping. He died in Macau on March 11, 1938.
