Fr. Constâncio TRIBUT

Born in Chapois, Jura, France, on June 5, 1880, he entered the Society of Jesus on September 27, 1898, at Barro. After his Novitiate, he spent one year at the Apostolic School of Guimarães, working as dean of studies and French teacher. He studied philosophy in Setubal. Then, he went to the Zambezia Mission (Mozambique) in 1907 to do his regency until 1911. Afterwards, he went to England, Ore Place, Hastins, to study theology (1911 - 1915). He was ordained priest on August 2, 1914, in Hastings. He professed his final vows on February 2, 1917, in Wimbledon, London. From September 1917 to September 1918, he worked as chaplain to Portuguese soldiers who were in England and was awarded, by the Portuguese Government, the Commendation of the Order of Christ. After his work as a chaplain, he continued living in England until his departure to Brazil in 1923 where he lived in Belém do Pará. He died on March 23, 1949, in Pará.
