Br PETER PERRODIN

12 December 1844 – 13 July 1914



Born in Switzerland, (home of the Matterhorn left) Peter Perrodin (in *Cat. Defunct.* PERRAUDIN) was nearly 40 years old when he entered the Society in 1883. He arrived in Africa in 1886, went to St Aidan's and moved to Dunbrody in 1892. In both places he was rectorian. He seems to have

also gone to Quilimane for a short time. He was in Vleischfontein in 1893 for a year as gardener, cook and, again, rectorian and returned to St Aidan's in 1895 and died at Port Alfred in 1914.

He had a physical and mental breakdown on hearing of the death of his brother who was also a Jesuit, in 1893, and never recovered. He could do no work for his last 20 years. He was, however, remembered as a gentle person and willing to oblige. It is not possible, after the passing of so many years, to decipher what was really going on behind these bare facts.

13 July

12 December 1844 – 13 July 1914

Br. Pedro PERRODIN

Born in Loutier-Valais, Switzerland, on December 12, 1844, he entered the Society of Jesus on January 9, 1883. He was sent to the Zambezia Mission (Mozambique) in 1886 and was assigned to live and work in Sena. He went to northern Zambezia in 1887. He took his final vows on February 02, 1893. He died on July 13, 1914, in Fort England, South Africa.
