Fr Alexander Muyebe, SJ was born in Mulanje, Malawi, on the 27th of July 1968 to Clement and Lydia Muyebe. He was the second born in a family of three boys. One of his brothers is a Dominican Priest in South Africa, Fr Stanislaus Muyebe, OP. Fr Alex is survived by his mother, Mrs Lydia Muyebe.

Before he joined the Society of Jesus, Alex took a BSc Economics at the University of Zimbabwe, worked in a bank and spent some time with the Marist Brothers up until his Postulancy. After his first vows in the Society of Jesus in 1994, he studied Philosophy in Harare as part of the pioneer class of the then Arrupe College, now Arrupe Jesuit University. After his regency, done at the Jesuit Centre for Theological Reflection in Lusaka, Zambia, he studied Theology at Hekima College in Nairobi, Kenya, and took a

Law Degree at the University of Birmingham, UK, and later did his professional training in Law at the Zambia Institute of Advanced Legal Education.

From 2013 to 2016, he served at the Jesuit Centre for Ecology and Development (JCED) as its executive director. We can consider him as one of the founders of this Centre. At JCED, people still remember him as being very professional and always very zealous in all he did for development. His dedication and commitment made the Centre fruitful. From 2016 to 2018, he was an associate advocate at Ellis & Company in Lusaka, Zambia.

For the past four years, he has been the director of the Jesuit Centre for Theological Reflection (JCTR) in Lusaka, Zambia. During this time, he became a beacon of hope, advocating for the rights of the marginalized, and tirelessly working for social justice across Zambia. His leadership was marked by a profound commitment to faith, justice, and intellectual engagement with critical societal issues, which strengthened JCTR's impact in policy advocacy and public engagement. His life embodied the Jesuit mission to serve with compassion and solidarity, reflecting our commitment to justice and the transformation of communities.

Fr Alex Muyebe passed away unexpectedly at the villa in Siavonga on the 8th of November 2024, where he was resting after a short illness. His funeral was held at 10am at St Ignatius Parish in Lusaka, Zambia, of which community he was a dedicated member. He was laid to rest at Kasisi Cemetery.
