Fr. Henrique BORREL

He was born in Menistrol d'Allier, Loire, France, on January 4, 1877, and entered the Society of Jesus on September 24, 1895, in Barro. He studied philosophy in Setubal. He went to the Zambezia Mission (Mozambique) in 1902 for his regency. After some time spent in Boroma, he went to Quelimane, to work as a teacher. He returned to Europe to continue his studies. He did theology in Oña, Burgos, Spain, where he was ordained priest on July 30, 1910. He took his final vows on February 2, 1912, in Salamanca. Then, he was sent to the Nun'Alvres Institute in Jette-Saint-Pierre, Brussels, where he worked as minister and French teacher. He went to Brazil and died in Belém, Cachoeira-Bahia on December 17, 1914. He wrote manuscript notebooks with cafreal tales in Portuguese and eChuabo and a month of Mary, Cf. APSI, 317/10, 11 and 12.
